Project Goals Reminder

STATED PURPOSE: Explore opportunities to redesign West Pennway between 17th and 21st Street for improved pedestrian and bicycling movements.

- Focus on improving problematic intersections at 17th Street and West Pennway and 21st
 Street and West Pennway to allow improved traffic flow, safer pedestrian and bicycling
 movements and stormwater runoff.
- Investigate the opportunities to construct sidewalks, bicycle lanes and bio-swales along the corridor.
- Provide recommendations for greater mobility options as well as additional greenspace.
- Recommendations should link Parks Department and Westside Housing properties and transform the corridor into a linear park.
- Recommend enhancements and amenities to the existing transit station at West Pennway, 21st and Summit Streets.



Feedback from Steering Committee

- Importance of community culture represented on the corridor (art, gardens, and events)
- Opportunity for safer pedestrian experience (focus on pedestrians and good sidewalks)
- Slow down the traffic and create clear crosswalks and directional signage
- Opportunities to gather as a community (add simple amenities to park land to show it is for use by community members, tables, benches, bike, racks, grills, games)
- The trees are important to save, and plant more of
- Express the linear park
- Connect library, community center, park spaces, and bus stop in clearer ways
- Keep maintenance and implementation at the forefront of design solutions
- Potential partners include: CAN Center, Neighborhood Association,
 Mattie Rhodes, Westside Housing, Bridging the Gap, KC Community
 Gardens, School, Library, PARKS!

Feedback from Technical Advisory Group

- Funding opportunities through MARC and Connected KC 2050 (regional transportation plan), submitted to project list by July deadline, to be updated at end of planning process to achieve higher score
- Potential watershed funding opportunities (Water services, Smart Sewer program)
- Education and workforce development opportunities on green infrastructure and parks training and maintenance (MARC, HCA and Westside Housing)
- Trail connection opportunities Heritage, Greenline,
 Rock Island Bridge

Design Scenarios

Main Components and Considerations for all Scenarios


- Continental striping for crosswalks (or decorative)
- 4-way crosswalks at intersections
- Protected midblock crossings
- 25-foot maximum unprotected crossing distance
- ADA slab and ramp upgrades
- 10' path for entire western length
- Stormwater collection in the identified wedge spaces
- Scalable and incremental implementation











Simple and Symmetrical


Features:

- Two 11' Lanes
- Does not require expensive retrofit or widening of off-street trail.
- Community-Implemented Art / Sculpture / Pavement Painting
- Bumpout / planter areas accommodate plantings in pavement zone / stormwater features, and protect crossings, but do not require wholesale reconstruction.





The Promenade


Features:

- Two 11' Lanes (+ Gutter Space)
- Accommodates multi-use path within existing curbs. Does not require expensive retrofit or widening of off-street trail.
- Flexible People Space: Food, Art, Seating, Events, Etc.
- Community-Implemented Art / Sculpture / Pavement Painting
- Large bumpout / planter areas accommodate large trees centered in pavement zone / stormwater features, protect crossings, transform feel of corridor but do not require wholesale reconstruction.
- Accommodates huge square footage (1.5 acres) for events and active programming but functions as a generous roadway and looks appealing when empty.
- Overall a big transformation with very little new infrastructure.



The Promenade













Meander

Features:

- Two 11' Lanes (+ Gutter Space)
- Protected multi-use path is outside of existing curbs.
- Flexible People Space: Food, Art, Seating, Events, Etc.
- Community-Implemented Art / Sculpture / Pavement Painting.
- Large bumpout / planter areas accommodate large trees that anchor the curve of the drive lanes within the existing pavement zone / stormwater features, protect crossings, transform feel of corridor but do not require wholesale reconstruction.
- Accommodates large square footage for events and active programming but functions as a unique and generous roadway and looks appealing when empty.
- Overall a big transformation with very little new infrastructure.



Pros

Simple and Symmetrical

- **Symmetrical**, clear, centered design
- Minimum change to the existing roadway
- More formal
- Modest stormwater management
- Opportunities for new vegetation

Promenade

- Adds community
 gathering space
 in-between the curbs
- Provides for flexibility,
 programming can
 adapt to current needs
- More opportunities for community art
- Adds a centerline of trees

<u>Meander</u>

- Links to river concept, opportunity for interpretive education
- Connection to adjacent uses and neighbors
- Significant stormwater management
- Opportunities for new trees
- Expands the wedge spaces into the street

Cons

Simple and Symmetrical

- Less public gathering space within the roadway than other options
- Lacks opportunity for new street trees within roadway

Promenade

- Programming and activating space may be challenging
- Minimal stormwater management potential
