El sábado 6 de Marzo, se invita a los residentes de West Side para que vengan a conocer el nuevo local.


"Tendremos café y galletas y las personas de la comunidad pueden venir y ver el lugar", indicó Lynda Callon, directora del centro.

After operating "in holes" for the past 10 years, the West Side Community Action Network (CAN) Center Inc., is in its new home, located on the corner of Avenida Cesar Chavez (23rd Street) and Jefferson Street in Kansas City, Mo.

On Saturday (March 6), West Side residents are invited to come and see the facility for themselves.

"We will have coffee and cookies, and people from the community can come and see the place," said Lynda Callon, the director of the Center.

The Center is important for the community because it is the community-policing site.

It also addresses community issues and provides a site where people can be picked up for work.

"We work to educate

neighbors on how to be responsible and civically engaged," said Callon.

They do this by providing a neighborhood newsletter; translating property codes and ordinance information into Spanish; and facilitating neighborhood cleanups, activities and relationship-building with the police.

The center also serves as a drop-in center for limited and non-English-speaking day laborers. On Monday (March 1), the center had a celebration for those who made the vision possible.
